Lee Reynolds

Lee Reynolds is an RPS Award and Sky Arts Award-winning conductor with a reputation for bringing intensity and exceptional detail to his performances.

Highlights include a production of Ravel's L'enfant et les sortilèges with VOPERA and the LPO, Kurt Weill's Street Scene at the Opéra de Monte Carlo, productions of Giacomo Puccini's La bohème with Welsh National Opera, Georges Bizets Carmen at Opera Holland Park, as well as performances with the LSO, Philharmonia, CBSO, Glyndebourne, BBC Philharmonic, Orchestra of Opera North, Beethoven Academy Orchestra in Kraków. Lee has a huge catalogue of recordings which have been lauded in the international press.

Kuljit Bhamra

Kuljit Bhamra is best known as a pioneer of the British Bhangra sound and for his many collaborations with musicians from different cultures. He has recorded and produced over 2,000 songs and is the recipient of many awards. His cutting-edge projects and ground-breaking educational work earned him the prestigious honour of MBE in 2009.

Kuljit is passionately committed to promoting the understanding of Indian instruments, and broadening their use in all types of music. He recently created the world's first electronic tabla and universal Indian drum notation system.

Dr Sita Thomas

Dr Sita Thomas is a presenter, director and producer based in Cardiff. She is currently Artistic Director and CEO of Fio theatre company. Thomas is passionate about championing and creating opportunities for Global Majority creatives. She holds a PhD from the University of Warwick and a Masters in Movement Direction from Royal Central School of Speech and Drama.

Sita is a trustee of Emergency Exit Arts and formerly of the Young Vic. She was a children's TV presenter of Channel 5's milkshake! from 2015 to 2023.

Belinda (Bindi) McFarlane

From Adelaide, South Australia, Bindi McFarlane came to London as Leader of the Australian Youth Orchestra for the BBC Proms. She liked it so much, she stayed – and continued further studies. After a period of freelancing and busking, Belinda joined the Second Violin section of the LSO.

A passionate advocate of the power of communication through music, Bindi has led workshops for LSO Discovery and with her piano trio fiorini around the world, and returns frequently to Australia to direct orchestras and training workshops. Bindi was a member of the LSO Board at one time in the position of Vice-Chair. She now serves on the LSO Discovery Advisory Committee.
